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II. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order and presided by the BAC Chairman CTCSupt. Ma. Lourdes M. Razon, MD at 9:15 in the morning.

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III. HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PRE-BID CONFERENCE

As to the query of CTCSupt, Razon if there is a quorum the BAC Secretariat replied in affirmative.

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CTCSupt. Razon acknowledged the presence of prospective bidders and asked them to introduce themselves and state the company they belong with. Further, she introduced herself and the other members of the BAC, Technical Working Group, and COA representative.

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CTOIl Catindig read out the lots to be bid and stated that it can be found at section 1 of the bidding documents. Further, he stated that the payment will be based on the actual number of PDL. He continued to discuss the amount of bidding documents on different lots. He also informed the prospective bidder that they could raise question along the way.

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CTOIl Catindig discussed the documents to be submitted as follows:

28 29 30 Similar contracts shall refer to food Subsistence such as but not limited to delivery or preparation, whether processed or in its original form, of food or edible materials for human consumption or those engaged in food business or food supply chain as defined in Food Safety Act of 2013.

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Bid data sheet Class A documents valid and current PhilGeps certificate of registration and membership in accordance with sec. 8.5.2 of revised IRR of R.A 9184. Suggested to still submit the legal and financial documents for post qualification purposes.

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Valid and current Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) Registration including Articles of Incorporation for Corporation, Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Registration for Sole Proprietorship and Cooperative Development Authority (CDA) for cooperative.

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Valid and current Mayor's/Business Permit issued by the city of municipality where the place of business of the prospective bidder is located. To include the Official Receipt.

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Valid and current Tax Clearance per Executive Order 398, series of 2005 as finally reviewed and approved by the BIR.

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Statement of prospective bidder of all its ongoing government and private contracts, including contracts awarded but not yet started, if any, whether similar or not similar in nature and complexity to the contract to be bid.

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Statement identifying the bidder's single largest completed contract, similar to the contract to be bid within the last four (4) years from the date of submission and receipt of bids equivalent to at least 50% of the ABC per lot.

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As to the query of Atty. Blas from MKCSI if bidding for all the lots should use only one SLCC for all lots, Mr. Catindig replied in affirmative.

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CTOIl Catindig continued and discussed the supporting documents:

- Certificate of end-user's acceptance (EUA) or Acceptance Report or official receipt (OR) or collection receipt (CR) or sales invoice (SI) issued for the contract, if completed, which shall be attached to the statements.
- Valid and current audited financial statements, showing among others the prospective bidder's total current assets, liabilities, stamped "received" by the BIR or its duly accredited and authorized institutions, for the preceding calendar year, which should not be earlier than two (2) years from the date of bid submission.
- Net Financial Contracting Capacity (NFCC) which must be at least equal to the ABC to be bid, and calculated as follows:
- NFCC = [(Current assets minus current liabilities) (15)] minus the value of all outstanding or uncompleted portions of the projects under ongoing contracts, including awarded contracts yet to be started coinciding with the contract to be bid.
- The values of the bidder's current assets and current liabilities shall be based on the latest AFS submitted to the BIR, through its Electronic Filling and Payment System (EFPS).
- In Lieu of the NFCC computation the bidder may submits a Committed Line of Credit (CLC)from a Universal or Commercial Bank, it must be at least equal to ten percent (10%) of the ABC to be bid in accordance with Sec 23.4.1.5 of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA 9184.
- Class "B" Documents:
- In case of Joint Venture: A Valid Joint Venture Agreement (JVA) for the project in case it is already in existence, or duly notarized statements from all the potential joint venture partners stating that they will enter into and abide by the provisions of the JVA in the instance that the bid is successful.

Atty. Villanueva stated that one of the requirements for an existing company newly entered into joint venture with a newly created entity is imbedded in E.O. 398. He emphasized that the tax clearance issued by the CED (Collection Enforcement Division) includes statement that there is no outstanding provision.

As to the query of Atty. Villanueva if a certificate of registration can be submitted in lieu of the outstanding obligation, including the certification from CED that the newly created entity has no outstanding obligation could be accepted, Atty. Santos stated that bidder may put query in writing so that the BAC can address the query properly.

Mr. Catindig stated that both parties who are under a JVA shall submit all the legal documents. He pointed out that there is no clear rule on whether tax clearance in case of JVA, may be replaced.

Atty. Lawrence stated that the tenor of the certification of CED is that there shall be no outstanding obligation or delinquency due to the BIR.

In case joint venture is not yet in existence, the submission of valid JVA shall be within ten (10) calendar days from receipt by the bidder of the notice from the BAC that the bidder is the Lowest Calculated Bid.





Atty. Villanueva stated that submission of valid JVA within 10 days from the determination of Lowest Calculated Bid would result in non compliance (not coincide) to the required 3-day period to submit the required post-qualification documents. Further, he pointed out that based on R.A. 9184, the reckoning period for the submission of a valid JVA is within 10 days from the date the Notice of Award (NOA) was received.

Atty. Santos stated that the issue being raised be put it into writing so that it can be addressed accordingly. Mr. Catindig stated that a supplemental bid bulletin may be issued to clarify the matter.

The Bidder shall have the option to post Bid Securing Declaration. Bid Securing Declaration must be duly notarized in accordance with the provisions of 2004 Rules on Notarial Practice or any form of Bid Security.

Cash or cashier/manager's check issued by a Universal or Commercial Bank.

 Bank draft/guarantee or irrevocable letter of credit issued by a Universal or Commercial Bank; provided however, that it shall be confirmed or authenticated by a Universal or Commercial Bank if issued by a foreign bank at least 2% of the ABC to be bid.

Surety bond callable upon demand issued by a surety or insurance company duly certified by the insurance commission as authorized to issue such security at least five percent (5%).

> Duly Conformed Schedule of Requirements

> Duly Conformed Technical specification

 Duly notarized Omnibus Sworn Statement. It must be supported by a Proof of Authority of the designated representative/s for purposes of this bidding.

 Duly notarized Special Power of Attorney –For sole proprietorship if owner opts to designate a representative/s; Duly Notarized Secretary's Certificate evidencing the authority of the designated representative/s, issued by the corporation, cooperative or the members of the joint venture;

Packaging and sealing of documents were presented as follows; Each Bidder shall submit the following in one (1) big envelope duly labelled containing two sets of envelopes: First envelope must contain four (4) copies of Eligibility and Technical Documents duly marked as "Copy No.1", "Copy No.2", "Copy No.3" and "Copy No.4"Second envelope must contain four (4) copies of Financial Bid Form duly marked as "Copy No.1", "Copy No.2", "Copy No.3" and "Copy No.4".

Mr. Catindig stated that the venue for the submission and opening of bids is at the BAC conference Room NBP Reservation, Muntinlupa City.

CSSupt. Bravo stated that in case many bidders will participate for the Submission and Opening of bids another venue for this event will be posted through a supplemental bid in order to accommodate all bidders.

Mr. Catindig stated the date and time for the submission and opening.

As to the query of Atty. Blas that there is no bid reference number, Mr. Catindig stated that it can be viewed on PhilGeps.

Grouping and Evaluation of Lots. Partial bids are allowed. All Goods are grouped in lots listed below. Bidders shall have the option of submitting a proposal on any or all lots, evaluation, and contract award will be

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Mr. Catindig mentioned the schedule of food serving.

CTOIl Catindig presented the schedule of requirements and responsibilities of the bidder.

As to the query of Atty. Blas that non-requirement of a dietician will not be required, it may violate Food Safety Act, Atty. Santos stated that the issue be put into writing so that the BAC can address the query properly.

Atty. Santos stated that the use of kitchen will be subject to the approval of Director General. He added that the use of inmate as workers or helpers needs a request addressed to the Overseer for the directives and recommendation for medical certificates subject for the approval of the Superintendents.

 As to the query of Ms. Dina from MKCSI if it would be possible that the PDL's who had undergone the physical screening test and training from the caterer would be exempted in case of classification from Maximum to Medium since it's hard for them to train another PDL and that it would be costly for them again to undergo such, Atty. Santos stated to put it on writing so the BAC could address it properly. CSSupt. Bravo added that they would take it into case to case basis and if that would be the case it would violate the BuCor Manual as to what is stated particularly on the classification of inmates.

As to the query of Atty. Blas from MKSI if how would the BAC accommodate the three other winning bidders as well as the facilities of delivery and other logistical services since there is only one existing kitchen facility at the maximum security camp considering there is a possibility that there will be four winning bidder, Atty. Santos stated that the bureau is not bound to provide the kitchen facility but the winning bidder could request a facility for them to be used and take it into consideration that the outright approval of such could not be possible. He also added to put their query into writing and the BAC would address it.

Security Precautions; the winning bidder shall strictly follow all rules, regulations, and security guidelines issued by the Office of the OIC of the Security Camps and Chief of the General Kitchen Section.

Use of General Kitchen inside NBP; the winning bidder may be allowed to use the General Kitchen inside the respective camps upon written request to the Director General and upon Approval of the same subject to reasonable rent and payment in such event, the procuring entity shall install water and electric consumption of the winning bidder. The winning bidder shall pay directly their bill to the BuCor's Cashier's Office.

Electricity; electricity consumption will be charged to the account of the winning bidder and will be billed on a monthly basis. Bucor shall install a Kilowatt Hour Meter with ERC seal and meter test report to determine actual energy consumption including wiring components.

Water; water consumption will be charged to the account of the winning bidder and will be billed on a monthly basis.

 Fuel; Fuel for cooking shall be on the winning bidder's discretion subject to usual prison rules and regulation



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
