3. DEFINITION OF TERMS AND ACRONYMS

3.1. **TERMS**

Vital Signs	• Clinical measurements, specifically pulse rate, temperature, respiration rate, and blood pressure that indicate the state of a patient's essential body functions.
Observation	• Observation services are hospital outpatient services given to help the doctor decide if the patient needs to be admitted as an in-patient or can be discharged. Observation services may be given in the emergency room covered under certain circumstances. A patient may also be placed on an observation stay for the preparation of a laboratory examination then will be discharge after the said examination.
